






Tree Fruit Pruning - Renovation





Maintenance pruning






Pruning Bearing Fruit Trees

Upright: generally too vigorous

Hanging: generally shaded, poor quality fruit





Rejuvenate? Just enjoy it, and plant the replacement






Neglected apple






Remove upright limbs but keep "boss" limbs above the cut point to control regrowth at cut point





Renovating - spring year 1 -- before






Renovating - spring year 1 -- after






spring year 1, after cutting

Neglected apple 1 - before cut






Neglected apple 1 - after cut
